CIH Ethics Review Checklist

The Centre for International Health (CIH) conducts a wide range of activities, often involving vulnerable communities and marginalised populations. Because of the nature of our work, it is essential that the ethical implications of every CIH project be considered. Some projects or project components require full ethical review by an ethics committee, whereas others may only require low risk review or be exempt from review altogether.

The following checklist has been designed to facilitate the process of deciding whether or not a project or project component is exempt from ethical review. This checklist is only required for projects or project components that may **not** need ethics review. If it is already known that the project or specific component does require review by an ethics committee then this checklist does not need to be completed.

¹ Non-identifiable: Data that have **never** been labelled with individual identifiers or from which identifiers have been **permanently removed**, and by means of which no specific individual can be identified.

² **Negligible risk** is where there is no foreseeable risk of harm or discomfort, and any foreseeable risk is no more than inconvenience.
